Genesis Chapters 1-11: Theology and Science

Course Description: In this course, David Penny will discuss the Biblical account of the world before and after the Fall; the world between the Creation and the Flood; the Flood and the geophysical changes it caused on the earth and the post Flood world; and origin of languages. Michael Windheuser will discuss how both science and faith support the validity of Biblical revelation and the account of origins given in Genesis. The Creation/Evolution controversy will be discussed along with the implications of discoveries from the fields of genetics, cell biology and paleontology.
